TO THE PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS OF CHILDREN IN ROOMS 1 TO 3

A number of children in rooms 1 to 3 appear to have come down with a vomiting/stomach bug. This bug does seem to be pretty contagious and so we are requesting ...

Finally ... Might you be interested?

We are currently looking at teaching virtues, and promoting wellbeing, through simple narratives (stories). Even the simplest stories (including picture books) can contain deep and highly relevant messages about life, its ups and downs, how to deal with the stuff life can throw at you, accepting difference, valuing self and others, practising forgiveness, overcoming, being accepting of others, and being kind to yourself etc etc.


We are keen to cherry pick the best examples, purchase multiple copies for use right up the school, revisit common themes throughout the years, and go deeper and wider in understanding and application.

We think we can source hard copies of these books (possibly around 8 core books) for \$30-\$40 each. We would like to purchase one for each class and maybe have a few spares. This book was on the required reading list for a Masters level psych course I did some years back ... the key message ... we struggle ... it hurts ... but our problem doesn't need to own us ... But then there are other messages here too!


Using narratives could be a breakthrough way to insight and understanding, as well as providing tools to navigate the common (and sometimes difficult) experiences of life.
