<u>Digital Devices 2025 – from last week</u>


The school prefers Chrome Books please as these fill our device needs better than iPad.

Parents of children in years 5 and 6 should feel under no pressure to purchase devices for their children. While it is preferable for year 5 and 6 children to have their own devices, we can provide non-take-home devices for a limited number of children.

We request that year 7 and 8 students have their own devices if possible please (Chromebook 8 gb of RAM, or HB or ACER 8 gb RAM) but are very happy to work with parents where this presents a challenge. No child will go without a device.

We will continue to ensure that time on devices is not overdone ... our target is a maximum of 30% of learning time on devices.

<u>Class Lists</u>

These will be on display on the hall noticeboard **Wednesday the 18th December - 2:00 pm**. The staff will have put a huge amount of time into getting placements as close to optimal as they can, and parent requests will have been carefully considered. Sometimes a request by one parent can be directly countered by the request of another parent, and sometimes we do not feel a request is in the interest of the child or their peers. Lists go through multiple stages before they are finalised. Prior experience has indicated to us the importance of friendships; every effort is made to ensure that every child is placed with at least one of their close friends. Where all requests cannot, for whatever reason, be met, we aim to meet at least one request where we can. Having said all of this, there must be give and take, reflection (and time - even a day or two) can bring perspective, and change can be a very positive thing. All rooms will be staffed by outstanding teachers, delivering outstanding programmes, surrounded by outstanding kids (who have outstanding parents!). Changes to lists after their publication are unlikely to be made.

<u>Some Data</u>

We are required to share data with you to give you an impression of school achievement. Progressive and Achievement Tests (PAT's) are standardised tests (formal with no teacher input or interpretation) and are normed by age to the general school population. These tests (or similar) are now mandatory for NZ schools. Stanines 1 to 3 are designated by the test designers as below average, and levels 4 through 9 as at or above average. Listening comprehension is a fairly good indicator of innate ability and can be a good indicator of how a school is doing - if a school is exceeding its Listening Comprehension score then it is considered to be generally doing well. We are extremely happy with the results. Even though the PAT tests are normed for March, they are still useful at end of year as a measure of progress.
