




With respect to interviews

- ... please be on time and move with the bell
- ... note down any questions beforehand
- ... we suggest that you do not book back to back interviews. A ten minute break between interviews will help you transit from one interview to the next, enable you to reflect on discussions and prepare for your next interview
- ... please note that buses will run at their normal times on both interview days.

Further interviews

If the above interview days do not suit, please know that all teachers are highly available by appointment. So if you didn't cover what you wanted to cover, or if you would like a deeper discussion in an area of interest or concern, please contact your child's teacher directly or phone the school office.



Finally

Thank you to those parents who work diligently to get their children to school for each school day. Numerous factors determine a child's educational and life success, but regular school attendance is undoubtedly near the top of this list. If we can help in any way to improve your child's attendance, please let us know. Equally, if there is anything that is making them reluctant to come to school, please let us know early, sometimes problems can be very quickly solved if we know about them, and attend to them thoughtfully. Currently only 56% percent of our children attend school more than 90% of the time, and 85% more than 80% of the time. The most common cause of absence is illness (understandable), followed by holidays taken during term time, and reasons deemed noncompliant with attendance regulations.

Patterns of poor attendance are hard to break and so this is a trap worth avoiding. We are here to help and so keep in touch. We are aiming for improved rates of attendance in term 1 of 2025 and with your support we are confident of achieving this.
